Temporary Measures for the Use of SafeSeaNet Norway (SSNN)

To manage delays and ensure operational continuity:

- Until further notice, the Norwegian Coastal Administration will maintain the option to upload attachments in the legacy version of SSNN. This allows operators to continue fulfilling their reporting and information obligations (MO) digitally by uploading manifests related to port calls.
- The arrangement for calendar-based clearance will continue to operate as it does today, using DIGIKAL in Box 44 of the customs clearance document.

This provides flexibility during a transitional period in which both new and existing solutions must be supported.

Further Development and Current Status

- More operators than expected, including transport providers, have already chosen to integrate directly with Digitoll through the Norwegian Customs Administration's APIs.
- The Norwegian Coastal Administration will continue to provide arrival event notifications, including those originating from the legacy version of SSNN. This means that automatic clearance will continue to function for operators using a combination of systems.
- It remains possible to:
 - Report port calls in the legacy version of SSNN.
 - Fulfil digital reporting and information obligations directly with the Norwegian Customs Administration.

Deadlines and Requirements

All operators must adapt to the new requirements:

1. The deadline for fulfilling the reporting and information obligation (MO) digitally is **15 September 2026**, in accordance with the data requirements described in Appendix 5 of the regulations.

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2. Maritime operators may fulfil this obligation by uploading PDF attachments in the legacy version of SSNN containing information that meets the data requirements, or by submitting all customs information through the Norwegian Customs Administration's API.
3. Once the new SSNN is fully functional and the industry has been given sufficient time to adapt to the new solution, the option to upload attachments in the legacy version of SSNN will be phased out.

Operators are encouraged to continue adapting to the new solution to ensure efficient compliance and take full advantage of the new opportunities it offers.
